do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord

is. 18 Do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery; but be filled with the Spirit, 19 as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts. 20 giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Reflection: *In Solomon's prayer, we find a fresh start is always possible with a willing heart. Jesus calls us to be fed by the bread of life, transforming ourselves to transform the world.*

Whatever faith we profess, we are assured that only those "who seek the Lord" will be truly satisfied. Those who seek to be great, to be better than/holier than/smarter or more powerful, will be left hungry.
