[Think & Pray...]

Meditation: "She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."

Reflection: Peter Price - echoing James, says, "Proverbs, and the psalmist ask us uncomfortable questions about how privilege and class distinctions affect our life of faith. We, like Jesus in response to the Syro-Phoenician woman, must learn to re-evaluate our own privilege in light of others' lack and to become inclusive of the excluded.

Your Action: What privileges do you have in your life? Recall those who do not share your privileges. How will you seek to obey James' instruction not to let class (or any other) distinctions enter into your faith in Jesus Christ?

[The Scripture] [ames 2::1~17

5 Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? 6 But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? 7 Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that



was invoked over you? 8 You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as

yourself." 9 But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. 10 For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. 11 For the one who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. 12 So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. 13 For judgment will be without mercy to anyone

who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment. 14 What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? 15 If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? 17 So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

Read mark 7::24-37 and proverbs 22::1-2, 8-9, 22-23
