proverbs 1::20-33

20 Wisdom cries out in the street; in the squares she raises her voice. 21 At the busiest corner she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks: 22 "How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple? [The Scripture] mark 8::29-37

29 He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." 30 And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him. 31 Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. 32 He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 33 But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." 34 He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. 35 For those

who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. 36 For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? 37 Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? 38 Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

Meditation: Jesus said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."

Reflection: Jesus, with James, Proverbs, and the psalmist, teaches us to renounce self, to rid ourselves of that which resists the "New Way" of Jesus, becoming cooperative in His work of reconciliation. But Jesus goes further, telling us to take up the cross, to fully experience the exclusion and punishment that come with struggling against this world's paths of injustice.

Miguel D'Escoto of Nicaragua once observed, "I don't think we Christians have understood what carrying the cross means: the path of baptism. We are not carrying the cross when we are poor or sick, or suffering small everyday things. They are all part of life. The cross comes when we try to change things. That is how it came for Jesus." Let's get it straight!

Your Action: Do you agree with Miguel D'Escoto's understanding of carrying the cross? Where do you fit into his observation...?
