Meditation: "Today also my complaint is bitter; his hand is heavy despite my groaning. Oh, that I knew where I might find him, that I might come even to his dwelling! I would lay my case before him, and fill my mouth with arguments. job 23::2-4

Reflection: Hebrews exhorts us, "We must hold firm to our profession of faith." Such words fall on deaf ears unless they are connected to the reality of suffering, as we find in Job, Psalm 22, and Mark. We should hold on to our faith - with all its rage, despair, and confusion - because "Jesus ... is not incapable of feeling our weakness with us, but has been put to the test in exactly the same way as we ourselves ... apart from sin."

Your Action: When have you experienced the despair of Job, or the anger of the psalmist? How did you express it? Where have you discovered Jesus as interpreter of your pain, offering the solace of others and the challenge to live in the spirit of Jubilee?
