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

Meditation: Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another

"The LORD kills and brings to life; he brings down to Sheol and raises up" 2 samuel 2.6

to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching. heb. 10.23-25

[The Scripture]

mark 13.1-8

1 As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!" 2 Then Jesus asked him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down." 3 When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, 4 "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are



about to be accomplished?" 5 Then Jesus began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. 6 Many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. 7 When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. 8 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birthpangs.

Reflection: The end-of-year readings for the gospel of Mark rely heavily on end of days themes. Eschatological, or "final judgment," texts were always popular during times of severe persecution and oppression, in both Jewish and Christian circles. They provided hope for those experiencing persecution and reminded believers that suffering and evil, while mysteries, were not meaningless.

The community was encouraged to remain faithful despite adversity, for God too shall remain faithful... The Christian community was truly expecting Jesus' second coming, and thus the end of the world. The writer of Hebrews reminds them to observe the laws of God as revealed in Christ, now and "all the more as you see the Day approaching" heb 10.25.

Your Action: When have you experienced personal "apocalypse" prior to knowing Christ? How did you deal with the "throwing open (or laying bare)" of your crisis? Are their *good* calamites that you have experienced that lead to sacrificial closeness to God—embracing the "Way" of Jesus? How can you encourage others as "the *Day* approaches?"
