Reflection: An Everlasting Dominion

Eschatological themes again dominate the readings in this, the celebration of Christ the King, which also marks the end of the liturgical year. The true king shall liberate his people and reign forever.

In a recent article, freelance writer Michaela Bruzzese, calls us to be “beatitude kings” who imitate Jesus as leaders for justice and mercy. Though the path for such leaders will be difficult, we can have confidence because, as Revelation tells us, Jesus is at the beginning and the end of our story.
