psalm 1

1 Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers. 2 But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night. 3 He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers. 4 Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away. 5 Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous. 6 For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

Your Notes:

Meditation:

"Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers. 2 But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night. 3 He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers." (Ps.1 .1-3)

[The Scripture]

luke 6.17-26

17 He went down with them and stood on a level place. A large crowd of his disciples was there and a great number of people from all over Judea, from Jerusalem, and from the coast of Tyre and Sidon, 18 who had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases. Those troubled by evil^a spirits were cured, 19 and the people all tried to touch him, because power was coming from him and healing them all. 20 Looking at his disciples, he said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. 21 Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. 22 Blessed are you when men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man. 23 "Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their fathers treated the prophets. 24 But woe to you who are rich, for you have already received your comfort. 25 Woe to you who are well fed now, for you will go hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will mourn and weep. 26 Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is how their fathers treated the false prophets.



[Think & Pray...]

Reflection: Today's readings are full of blessings and curses. But just who is blessed? For the psalmist, it is those who "delight in the law of the Lord," who follow "the way of the righteous." For Jeremiah, it is those who "trust in the Lord"—which is far deeper than a matter of mere belief.

Jesus' blessings are much more specific, though their meaning is not as obvious. "Blessed are you who are poor. Blessed are you who are hungry now." Jesus is not just telling us how to be happy; he's not saying, "You should be poor, then you'll be happy." Rather, he says, if you are hungry now, when the reign of God arrives in its fullness, you will be filled.

Jesus is proclaiming the complete reversal of the fortunes of the rich and the poor, the powerful and the powerless, the full and the empty - and this overturning of the human order of things is not for some far-off future time, but is among us, for us to choose,
