Meditation: “ ‘How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.’ Jesus answered, ‘I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life,...’”

(John 10.26-28a)

Reflection: “It is impossible to follow this shepherd without walking into pain—one's own as well as that of the world. It is impossible to follow without understanding the cross and the commandment to pour ourselves out for enemy and friend.

Revelation 7 holds forth the image of a throng gathered around the throne of the Lamb. As we read the passage, can we picture the faces of people we know? May we take comfort in the promise it offers for our journey:.

...the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more... for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes. (Revelation 7.15-17)
