Meditation: *“Many will come in my name and say, ‘I am he!’ and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birthpangs.”* Mk 13.6-8

Reflection: The end-of-year readings for the gospel of Mark rely heavily on end of days themes. Eschatological, or “final judgment,” texts were always popular during times of severe persecution and oppression, in both Jewish and Christian circles. They provided hope for those experiencing persecution and reminded believers that suffering and evil, while mysterious, were not meaningless.

The community was encouraged to remain faithful despite adversity, for God too shall remain faithful.... The Christian community was truly expecting Jesus' second coming, and thus the end of the world. The writer of Hebrews reminds them to observe the laws of God as revealed in Christ, now and "all the more as you see the Day approaching" Heb 10.25.
