

Meditation:

I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me,"

John 10.11—14

Reflection:

Like hired hands who leave the flocks to the wolves, Jerusalem's religious elite in Acts 4 abandon their pastoral responsibilities in the face of imperial power. In contrast, the Good Shepherd always sides with the victims of imperial power, unless that power is resisted in sacrifice. -Peter B. Price

still waters home church studies

Psalm 23

[Worship]

1 The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want. 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; 3 he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. 4 Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff—they comfort me. 5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. 6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD my whole life long.

Consider: [Words]

The context for John's gospel is the tense opposition to Jesus and his followers from synagogue leaders. Schism within the early church over Jesus' humanity colors the first Johannine epistle. Neither can squelch the hands-on immediacy of Jesus' love: The later healing by the disciples is "by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth" (Acts 4.10).

Though 1 John 3 is born in the turbulent culture of early church upheavals, its haunting question convicts the wealthy nations of the world (both local, nationally within the US, and globally) of our 21st Century realities: "How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's

goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?" (1 John 3.17).

This Psalm 23 Shepherd leads the anxious to stillness, restores their souls, and will ultimately prepare a table for them in the presence of their enemies (5).



Providential help comes in those actions that imitate Jesus' shepherding love.

Where might that lead us today, in our pilgrimage of becoming the Church Jesus commissions to area(s) of influence?
